INTER-PANDEMIC PHASE

PANDEMIC ALERT PHASE

4. Small cluster(s) with limited human-to-human transmission but spread is highly localized, suggesting that the virus is not well adapted to humans.

5. Larger cluster(s) but human-to-human spread still localized, suggesting that the virus is becoming increasingly better adapted to humans, but may not yet be fully transmissible (substantial pandemic risk.)

PANDEMIC PHASE

6. Pandemic Phase: increased and sustained transmission in general population.

requires

Activate agency COOP/Pan flu plan and begin implementing protective measures
Begin evaluating critical service delivery in context of resources available and risk
Coordinate with/monitor resource providers
Continue to coordinate with local, state, federal and private sector partners

5. Spread throughout the United States

requires

Maintain essential law enforcement functions
Enforce orders of quarantine/isolation as required
Prevent/respond to civil disturbances
