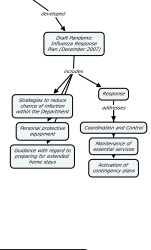
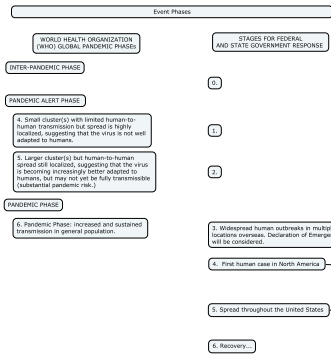
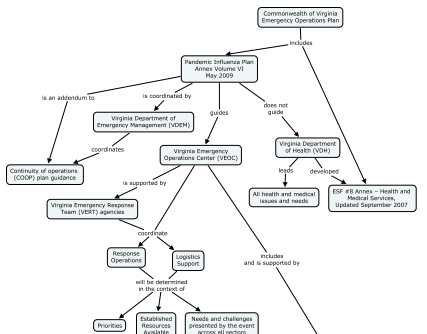

Activate agency COOP/Par Plan and begin implementing protective measures. Begin executing critical services. Review by contact of resources available and risk. Continue to coordinate with local, state, federal and private sector partners.

Reassign essential law enforcement functions. Perform roles of essential facilities as required. Prevent/respond to civil disturbances.

All law enforcement functions associated with supporting the response to and recovery from an influenza pandemic event will be coordinated through ESP 13: Public Safety and Security, as in any other disaster event. The VASMS may be called upon to support local and state law enforcement resources in the event of widespread civil disorder. Although additional law enforcement and security resources may be available through the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC), the federal government, as well as the private sector, it is assumed that the level of support available from these channels will also be compromised, and therefore limited in comparison to most other types of disasters.

During a pandemic event, Public Safety personnel will provide law enforcement support for providers of medical services. This includes that the state and secure movement of emergency medical services (EMS) assets and providing grounds for medical facilities. ESP currently has an additional strength of 1,276 troopers trained and equipped to ensure the secure and expeditious transportation of EMS resources. These troopers, along with 200 investigative personnel, can also provide security for medical facilities as needed. VSP has a variety of special purpose vehicles, equipment, and teams to support these functions.
